ARTICLE III. REGISTRATION, LICENSING, LEGISLATIVE ACTION

Section 1 – Registration, Licensing, Legislative Action

1. ASID supports the pursuit of legal recognition of the profession of interior design. In doing so, ASID believes accomplishing legal recognition is best achieved through the enactment of legislation that:
 - a. Does not limit, restrict or prevent the practice of interior design;
 - b. Does not limit, restrict or prevent anyone from using the title “interior design” or “interior designer;”
 - c. Allows state-qualified interior designers to (a) use the title “registered,” “certified” or “licensed” interior designer and (b) perform such additional services related to the practice of interior design as applicable governing jurisdictions deem appropriate for state-qualified interior designers to perform. 2. ASID supports the National Council for Interior Design Qualifications (NCIDQ) as the body whose professional exam tests minimum competency for state qualified interior designers. (amended 1/09)
